



Mental Health Service

Supported accommodation for adults living with persistent mental health challenges who are experiencing, or at risk of, homelessness.

What is our Mental Health Service?

We provide short to medium-term supported accommodation for adults with persistent mental health challenges who are experiencing, or at risk, of homelessness.

We offer a range of support and referral services to help you manage and cope with the process of finding a safe place to live.

Community Recovery Village

One, two and three bedroom units in small groups, located within the Perth metropolitan area. You will have regular access to a recovery Team Leader who will work with you to develop your individual recovery plan.

Accommodation Units

Two units with three bedrooms in each, located across the Perth metropolitan area. You will have regular access to a support worker who will work with you to develop your individual recovery plan.



Mental Health Support Services

We base our services on a recovery and trauma-informed practice. We offer mental health support and referral services to help you manage and cope with the process of finding a safe place to live.



SUPPORT

Regular meetings with a support team and optional meetings with our Wellbeing Chaplaincy Service.



ASSISTANCE

Help to develop skills to be able to live independently with a view to secure long-term accommodation.



ADVOCACY

Advocacy and advice to relevant and useful external agencies.



HEALTH PROMOTION

Access to health promotion and wellbeing advice, including coaching support.



REFERRAL

Referral to appropriate health and community support agencies.

Who is Eligible?

To access St Bart's Mental Health Service, applicants must be currently engaged with or eligible to access a Community Mental Health Service.

The following criteria must also be met:

- People aged 18+
- Experiencing, or at risk of, homelessness.
- Living with persistent mental health challenges.
- Have low to medium support needs.
- Willing and able to live in shared accommodation.
- Willing to engage with the support program and work towards finding long-term accommodation.
- Willing to be respectful to staff, other residents and St Bart's property.
